Austin Jorgenson introduced Alex? who presented a program on "Campaign to Save the Boundary Waters". He described how mining in the area contaminates the waters, both run-off and

subterranean. Heavy metals from the mining of iron, creates a bad environment for wild-life and aquatic life. This in turn can end up being a pollutant for humans consuming these critters.

There is a Chilean company ready to mine in an area of the boundary waters currently. So far this is not meeting all the standards, but may in the near future. This company does open-pit type of mining. Most of us have seen the ravages of that in this country. If you haven't, go to the coal country in the Appalachians. If that doesn't convince you of the scars left after this type of mining, go out west to the large mining operations in Wyoming. Then drop down through the Rocky Mountains where there are still large gold, copper, molybdenum, lead mining, etc. with open pits that are no longer producing. This leaves scars that may be interesting to observe, but are ugly in a natural setting. Many leave waste that still sits in ponds after many years past production.

I think this Alex has a good argument for controlling these types of mines. The plus side is that they do produce a few more jobs, and make some wealthy people more wealthy.
