

The officers explained the extensive training that the dogs receive. It may take 1-2 years to complete the program.

- 1. The officers train their dogs and the dogs become 'their' dog, but still owed by the department.
- 2. The dogs are 'detection' trained to detect specific things, usually 'one scent at a time.
- 3. They are 'force' trained sometimes. Erik's German Shepherd is strong and capable of breaking human bones, if necessary. Terry's English Brown Lab is smaller, so would be used more for 'detection.' He found the explosive hidden in the lounge and sat and pointed.
- 4. Dogs will respond primarily to their owner but may respond to commands from someone else, especially in 'play' mode.
- 5. Dogs are trained to be gunfire 'neutral', meaning they don't go to or from gunfire.
- They don't train the dogs to be 'Angry', but everything is a game for the dog. He knows he will consistently receive his reward, usually a toy or food.
- 7. The trainer is always present when the dog is in house around others. Erik has three kids and they are free to play with the dog. However, Erik is ALWAYS present. Otherwise the dog is on a leash and lives outside year round. Erik is 'responsible' and liable'

Currently the department has 6 dogs. They are used an average of 5+ times a month. Erik admits that most of the officer's days can be pretty boring, but they have to be ready and they HAVE to be with their dog.

This program was interesting to all of us. It is a service available to law enforcement for search and rescue in the community.



Officer Rey Caban, also from the Rochester PD, tried to educate us on the 'Drone' that the department has acquired. He says the drone can be used in 'People Crimes.'

UAV (Unnamed Arial Vehicle) I gleaned only a few memorable facts;

- 1. It can remain airborne for 18-20 minutes.
- 2. Can navigate in wind from 10-50 mph
- 3. Ground speed from 10-65 mph
- 4. Range 1-4 miles
- 5. It has a quality 'day camera' as well as IR for night.
- 6. Operates on re-chargeable battery. (price \$1500)
- 7. Department has \$75K in one.

My figures may be off, but give an idea of the investment. It doesn't have to be manually operated. Set it with GPS.



****It was voted to try the policy for cancelling our meeting. To be set to follow the Public School. If they cancel, we cancel and let our Hotel know quickly.


****Pizza Ranch project is coming up in March, we think. Cindy will get information to us soon.
