Kin Sin was speaker May 3. He is a former Cambodian refugee. He related his family history of persecution by the



Khmer Rouge in his country. He basically gave us a thumbnail history lesson of that part of Asia. His description of the persecution was to (1) get rid of the educated population. (2) get rid of the families of those educated. The government could control the rest of the population easier.

People can be very cruel, as we know. His countrymen still have trouble with the thousands of land mines planted at the time of their war.

Kim is here permanently. He says there are about 3000 Cambodians in Rochester now. Most are invisible to most of the population, preferring to stay with their own people.

The Cambodians formed groups with leaders, but were very suspicious of people after living in such corrupt surroundings in Cambodia.

Kim works at integrating his people into the American way of life. The education dropout rate in high school is very high and low rate going on to college. Kim says this is slowly improving. It is very different to move to a different country in a much different kind of climate and society. He is confident that they are making progress.
